

International WaterCentre (IWC) Partial Scholarships

Terms & Conditions

Definitions

- 'IWC' refers to the 'International WaterCentre Pty Ltd'
- 'the Scholarship' refers to the International WaterCentre's partial-tuition scholarships
- 'the Recipient' refers to a student who receives an IWC partial-tuition scholarship
- 'Program' refers to IWC Integrated Water Management programs (Masters, Graduate Diploma, Graduate Certificate)
- 'Self-Supported students' are students who do not benefit from any full-tuition funding, scholarship, grant or award from any government, public or private institution (including IWC Masters Scholarships).
- 'Domestic students' are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens and Australian permanent residents
- 'International students' are students who do not hold an Australian/New Zealand citizenship or Australian permanent resident visa

Availability

The Scholarship is available to the first 50 students who enrol in the IWC Integrated Water Management programs (Masters, Graduate Diploma, Graduate Certificate) in 2013. Recipients may be Domestic or International students. The Scholarship is restricted to students who do not receive external full-tuition scholarships or full-tuition funding from any other sources.

Value

50 Scholarships are available for the Program which begins in Semester 1, 2013.

Each IWC partial-tuition scholarship has a total value of AU\$ 5,000 for the whole Masters program. It is payable as follows:

Full-time study: AU\$ 5,000 for the whole Masters program, payable per semester towards tuition fees:

- Semester 1 (Graduate Certificate) - AU\$ 1,550
- Semester 2 (Graduate Diploma) - AU\$ 1,550
- Semester 3 (Masters) - AU\$ 1,900

Part-time study: AU\$5,000 for the whole Masters program payable per semester towards tuition fees (AU\$ 850 per semester: for 6 consecutive semesters to complete the Masters, 4 consecutive semesters to complete the Graduate Diploma, and 2 consecutive semesters to complete the Graduate Certificate).

The Scholarship is not redeemable for cash.

Recipients are responsible for paying the remainder of the tuition fees each semester and all other associated study or living expenses.

The Scholarship does not cover: travel, accommodation, field work, living costs, medical cover, insurance and any other study-related expenses such as materials, books and equipment. These costs will be the responsibility of successful recipients.

Restrictions

The Scholarship is:

- Available only to cover part of the tuition fees for the IWC Integrated Water Management programs (Masters, Graduate Diploma, Graduate Certificate) which commence in Semester 1, 2013
- Available in the year of offer only
- Available only to self-supported students who have been offered a place in the Program and have enrolled in it
- Not available with any other IWC scholarships
- Not to be used for any purpose other than the Recipient's tuition payment

Recipients may not concurrently hold another full-tuition scholarship from any other source. (International students are required to declare to IWC's partner university any source of full-tuition funding when enrolling into the program.) During the course of the Program, Scholarship Recipients are required to inform IWC in writing if their circumstances change and if they receive any new source of full-tuition funding (scholarship, grant or award).

Program of study

The Scholarship is to support students enrolled in the IWC Master of Integrated Water Management Program, IWC Graduate Diploma in Integrated Water Management or IWC Graduate Certificate in Integrated Water Management.

Duration of funding

The Scholarship is paid out over the semesters of study. The Program must be completed within a maximum of:

- Three consecutive semesters of full-time study or six consecutive semesters (three years) of part-time/distance study of the Master of Integrated Water Management
- Two consecutive semesters of full-time study or four consecutive semesters of part-time/distance study of the Graduate Diploma in Integrated Water Management
- One semester of full-time study or two consecutive semesters of part-time/distance study of the Graduate Certificate in Integrated Water Management
- The Scholarships are awarded on the basis that Recipients maintain an 'enrolled' status in their course of study.

Activities during scholarship period

Scholarship Recipients will be expected to participate in professional development activities beyond IWC Integrated Water Management programs regular coursework requirements. These additional activities are required but will not result in additional academic credit, and may include but are not limited to:

- Collaborating with International WaterCentre's marketing and communications department to participate in surveys, photo shoots or provide interviews and written articles for promotional purposes;
- Providing up to one to two hours per month for IWC research purposes as set forth by the International WaterCentre Program Managers;
- Present research at selected conferences throughout the duration of the program as designated by IWC.

Failure to participate in the aforementioned activities, when required, may result in the forfeiture of the Scholarship.

Withdrawal or termination of award

The Scholarship will terminate if:

- the Recipient withdraws from the Program
- the Recipient defers from the Program
- the Recipient does not conform to the Terms and Conditions of the Scholarship
- the Recipient does not conform to the relevant University partner's rules and policies.
- the Recipient does not complete each semester with satisfactory progress or if the Recipient fails a semester.

The Scholarship will terminate if the recipient does not resume the program at the conclusion of a period of approved leave of absence or does not make arrangements for the approval of an extension to the period of leave of absence. The Scholarship is tenable at the relevant partner university subject to satisfactory progress according to the partner university policies
